

## THE ROLE OF DESIGNATED LEAD FOR INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL IN SOCIAL CARE SETTINGS

### > What does this module involve?

This Foundation Degree Module is delivered at Northbrook College, an Affiliated College of University of Brighton and successful candidates will achieve Higher Education credits. Certification is gained by attending short interactive lectures and detailed group workshops, enabling the candidate to create a working document advising staff in complying with policies and procedures that will be assessed. Candidates will be expected to supplement the workshops & lectures with approximately 50 hours of reading and study for the entire module.

### Rationale

The new Code of Practice for Health and Adult Social Care Prevention and Control of Infections and related guidance requires all registered adult social care providers delivering regulated activities to identify and designate an individual within the service to be the lead for infection prevention and control. This course will assist this designated lead in fulfilling these duties and will also consider a best practise model.

### Aims

The module aim is to support the designated lead in understanding the role they will be required to undertake and the requirements the H&SCA 2008 Code of Practice place upon them.

To assist CQC-registered social care providers to comply with these requirements Northbrook College have designed this course aimed at supporting the role of Designated Lead for Infection Prevention and Control. This course is validated as a 10 credit HE module.
